

What a fantastic achievement by the Twisted Stitchers to mark Remembrance Sunday. We had to share it, and we hope that everyone got to see it in the flesh.



HISTORY CORNER

Thoughts of Remembrance Sunday led us to trawl through the archives of what was then the Wellington Journal for World War Two themed items. All these are fascinating in that they illustrate how much has changed since the 1940s, but also how similar people are in their attitudes and social obligations.

The first item about the public investing in War Bonds makes me wonder if that wouldn't be appropriate for today. £34 billion would go a long way towards keeping the Russians at bay.

HARMER HILL

"SALUTE THE SOLDIER." — The Harmer Hill "Salute the Soldier" week realized £1.463, which was £463 more than the target.

Send your "Advertiser" to some member of the Forces. It will bring home nearer to nim. But don't buy an extra copy if you can avoid it. This one is from April 1944. The huge sum of £1,463 invested is incredibly equivalent to nearly £83,000 today. But these were bonds not donations so you would have eventually got your money back. Nationally, the campaign raised over £34 billion in today's money.

Thelma Winrow later married our Uncle Herbert Griffiths. I'm sure she was pretty, but we probably wouldn't be allowed to say so these days! Also, we are not sure what "war work" was. The dance was held in June 1945

MYDDLE

WAR WORKER DANCE.—A dance held at the Lion on June 14, resulted in Miss Thelma Winrow, of Yorton, being chosen as the prettiest war worker, with Miss J. Hodnett, of Myddle, as runner-up.

HARMER HILL

"WELCOME HOME" FUND. — As a result of two recent whist drives £13 4s. has been raised for the "Welcome Home" Fund. This is also from June 1945. Perhaps people had got fed up with raising money by this time!

Finally, this is from 1933 so is referring back to the First World War. Could WW2 have been foreseen by this time? Hitler was appointed Chancellor of Germany in January of that year.

On a more local note, some older members of the community will probably recognise some of those names!

MYDDLE

ARMISTICE DAY. — Poppies were sold on Saturday by the Misses Jean and Ann Nesbitt in the village; Miss M. Williams, Webscott and the Lower Road; Mrs. J. Formstone, Myddle Wood, and Miss Annie Formstone, Houlston and Balderton. Two services were held at the Parish Church at 9-15 a.m. and at 7 p.m., the collections of which were devoted to Earl Haig's Fund. References to the Armistice and peace were also made on Sunday, and the hymn, "O Valiant Hearts," was sung.

YOUR CHURCHES NEED YOU!

Our beautiful churches in Mvddle and Broughton are sadly in dire financial straits with the outgoings vastly exceeding incoming funds. In 2024 the difference was £583 per month, but this is likely to increase to £764 this year. with the result



that, if this gap cannot be closed, we are looking at insolvency by 2028. Our churches are not subsidised by the Church of England (a view mistakenly held by many) and if they have to close then the church buildings would no longer be available to use for services, weddings, funerals or baptisms. Neither could they be used by the school or the local community. The churchyards would be maintained by the local council, but there would be no more burials or interment of ashes.

If you value our church heritage, even though you may not be a churchgoer yourself, perhaps you would consider making a one-off donation or, even better, set up a regular standing order to help us keep both churches open for use by all the community. The relevant bank details are as follows:

HARMER HILL PRESBYTERIAN CHURCH

Like most people who talk a lot, when someone else is speaking I am usually thinking about the next thing I am going to say, when I should be listening to the person who is speaking. It's a bad habit and several years ago in another life someone suggested to me that perhaps I should think about attending a "Christian Listening" course. The suggestion was made after a church meeting in which the main topic of discussion was, "What can our church congregation provide for the local community that other agencies can't or don't?" The answer turned out to be, "A listening ear."

Many people have important things to say but don't have the opportunity or the situation in which to express them. Not being able to express their feelings particularly about something personal to themselves can be a blight on their lives to the extent that they feel, invisible, inferior and worthless.

What they need is someone to listen to what they want to say, in a safe and confidential environment, without being criticized or given advice.

The course I attended was difficult for me because I had to practice being silent and actually listening to the person who was speaking to me. I had to visually focus on the person who was speaking and without interrupting their flow, at the appropriate time, relate back to them a summary of what they had told me in complete confidence using the words, "So what you are telling me is......" No comment was allowed. Nothing like, "Well, a similar thing happened to me." No advice was to be given even if asked for and the conversation was to be concluded when I asked the speaker how they felt after what they had said.

It took a long time and a great deal of practice before I felt confident enough to offer my services to the Christian Listening Team attached to my church. It took even longer to use what I had learned in ordinary conversations. In our modern world listening, really listening is not a widely used skill. Governments, institutions and people in authority generally don't listen to ordinary people because for them to engage with what is being said, may cause the listener to have to take action that they would rather avoid.

Jesus, the great listener taught that everyone is important to the world and to God. Everyone, no matter what their situation, has the need to be heard. In a world that doesn't listen, perhaps we, as current disciples of Jesus, have an important role to play making sure that anyone and everyone who needs a listening ear finds one close by.

Parish Council News

Six members of the public attended the latest meeting of the Council which was held in Myddle Village Hall on November 13th, seeking solutions to a variety of issues impacting on residents. These included:

(a) Concerns about the safety of everyone using the road leading from Ellesmere Road to Newton on the Hill, with a request for a 'Quiet Road' to be created.

It was noted that this would be the responsibility of Shropshire Council who currently have no policy regarding 'Quiet Roads' although it was on the list of future initiatives.

(b) A request for the reduction of the speed limit on Wem Road, Harmer Hill from 40 to 30mph:

The Council fully supported this request but previous requests had failed to gain the support of Shropshire Council's Highways Department or the Police.

(c) Replacement of the road markings at the Harmer Hill (Bridgewater Arms) junction following a recent accident.

It was noted that there was a planned road closure at the junction taking place on December 6th. when it was anticipated that the markings would be restored.

(d) Request for safety improvements to the footpath exit from Harmer Hill woods onto Ellesmere Road and clearing growth from the footpath leading down towards the Village Hall.

The Council agreed to look at the possibility of installing a mirror to enable walkers to view oncoming traffic and the state of the footpath needed to be reported on www.fixmystreet.com.

In the meeting which followed there were reports on various planned projects including:

Affordable Housing:

It was reported that there had been no further contact from either Shropshire Council or STAR Housing although it was noted that STAR was currently being re-organised and that only five local people had put in requests for affordable housing.

Harmer Hill Reservoir:

The recently appointed Enforcement Officer had confirmed that he had visited the site and met with the owner who apparently was supportive. However there is no indication of anything happening since that meeting apart from additional items accumulating on site. Shropshire Councillor Sarah Marston agreed to push for a Court Enforcement Order. Myddle Woodland Area:

Discussions are still on-going with Shropshire Council regarding the lease being extended to 99 years but Councillor Jackson suggested that any

renewal project should be extended to include hedgerows, verges and other areas. This was supported by Members but it was stressed that the work would be heavily dependent on volunteers from the Community becoming actively involved with planting and future maintenance. Planning Applications:

A range of applications had been received since the previous meeting, all of which had been considered by Members and responded to. Full details can be found on the Agenda for the meeting which is available on the Council web site.

Environmental Maintenance:
