

From the Rectory

Dear friends,

As we enter December you may be breathing a sigh of relief that this year is nearly over and looking forward to Christmas with a little more certainty than last year. It has certainly been a year of ups and downs, feeling at times like a game of Snakes and Ladders. Some form of normality is reached and then – just like with one roll of the dice - you are sliding back down and you have to start all over again and change plans. All the uncertainty we've had puts a new perspective on the Christmas story itself, because you realise how disrupting the events of the first Christmas were for those involved.

Mary and Joseph were engaged to be married, they no doubt had their plans for what their lives would look like, until the angel Gabriel turned up and sent all their plans out the window. HARMER HILL CHAPEL

I wonder which one of all the Christmas decorations in your home is the most important to you? In one household I heard of, it's something unusual that has pride of place as a Christmas decoration, Something, that over the years, has become a real symbol of the season for a lady called Jane and her family.

Just before Christmas some years ago, Jane's mother died, and while other people were preparing for Christmas and getting in the 'Christmas spirit', Jane just couldn't. Life for her was very flat, very painful and the future looked very bleak. It seemed that nothing she could do, and nothing anyone said to her made any difference at all. She didn't feel like Christmas, and when Jane told her husband, fearing that how she felt, would spoil Christmas for the rest of her family, she didn't really expect him to be able to help.

He said nothing at first, but got up, and went to the pantry, and after rummaging among Jane's bottles of spices, came back with one of the bottles. Then, he collected a piece of paper, cello tape and scissors. From the bottle he extracted one seed, which he dabbed onto a piece of cello tape, and this he stuck onto the paper. With a bit of blue-tack, he stuck the paper, with the seed attached, onto the edge of the mantle shelf. Jane picked up the spice bottle and read the label. It said, 'Mustard Seeds'.

'Remember Jesus' parable about the mustard seed?' he asked. 'You could have a 'Mustard Seed Christmas.'

Jane remembered that a mustard seed was the smallest of all seeds and yet it could grow into a tree large enough for birds to roost in. Jesus had used a mustard seed to describe the promise that came from God with every seed that God made and Jesus had used it to describe the hope that we can find when we turn to God, our Father.

Jane realised that, on her own, she couldn't do anything to change the way she felt, but God could. If God could take that little mustard seed and grow it into a tree, He could take a tiny seed of faith and grow it into a world of hope. Jane knew that faith is made up of two elements. What you choose to believe, and what you hope is the truth. You provide one, and God provides the other. When Jane looked at the mustard seed, she saw the promise of God and hope for the future, and she made her choice.

That Christmas and every Christmas since then, the mustard seed has had pride of place among the Christmas decorations in Jane's house. She and her

husband never miss an opportunity to share with curious guests, the hope and the faith that it symbolizes. On her own, Jane could do nothing, but God could, and He did. So, from Harmer Hill Chapel, we wish you, a 'Mustard Seed Christmas'. A Christmas full of hope, brought to you by God's promise in the birth of His Son.

Parish Council News

The latest meeting of the Council was held in Harmer Hill Village Hall on Wednesday 1st. November when a range of items were discussed after members of the public raised a number of items for Members to consider later in the full meeting or at future meetings. These included requests for an additional defibrillator in Harmer Hill, a footpath from the Bridgewater Arms to Pimhill and remedial work on the footpath from Harmer Hill Village Hall to the junction of Ellesmere Road and the road to Newton on the Hill. All of these will be considered in due course and actioned when possible.

Also raised were concerns about the proposed development of some affordable housing in Godings Lane, Harmer Hill, when the Chairman confirmed that nothing had moved forward since the last Council meeting and action was now being handled for the Council by an appointed Solicitor. Assurance was given that the public will be kept informed of any developments.

The following items were then considered in the full Council meeting:

Harmer Hill Reservoir:

There was general pleasure that Shropshire Council had now issued an enforcement order requiring all the recent development on the site to be removed and returning the area to its original state. The owners of the site can appeal this decision but only have a few months to register the appeal.

The Messenger:

Members welcomed a report from Councillor Greg Miller stating that two people had volunteered to take over responsibility for editing the Messenger and it would be fully operational in the New Year. This magazine is a valuable source of information for many people in the Community and it is heart-warming to find people who are still prepared to do voluntary work.

Road Safety Issues:

Shropshire Council has informed the Parish Council that Myddle School has been identified as one of the schools to have a 20mph speed restriction but that it may be two years before this can be put in place. They have promised to keep the Council informed of developments. An attempt to meet with the Road Safety Officer to discuss other issues has not been possible but we have since heard that he been ill for some time and a senior officer has now agreed to meet with representatives of the Parish to discuss concerns.

Planning:

Concerns had been raised over the way in which responses from the Parish Council were handled and that at times amended applications were not sent for consideration. As a result the Senior Planning Officer at Shirehall has been asked to carry out a full review.

BEATING THE BOUNDS

PART 1 - A little bit of history

There isn't room in this edition to tell you all we have to say, but over the next couple of issues of the Messenger all will become clear.

The parish system in England was established between the 8th and 12th centuries and an early form was long established by the time of the Norman Conquest. These areas were originally based on the territory of manors, which, in some cases, derived their bounds from Roman or Iron Age estates. Some large manors were sub-divided into several parishes.

The custom of "beating" or walking the parish boundary is therefore very old indeed with Wikipedia suggesting that it derives from the Roman festival of Terminalia. The point was to walk the boundary, making sure that there were no incursions from the neighbouring parish, and at the same time to celebrate and appease the various spirits of the natural world. Really though, the idea that one should be aware of the boundary of the locale where one was born and brought up is kind of obvious in the days before Google Maps or even the Ordnance Survey.

In pre-Reformation Christianity, Beating the Bounds was taken on by the Church as part of Rogation Week, where appeasing pagan spirits was replaced with celebrating the lives of the Saints. The custom was further formalised by introducing a regular 7 yearly cycle, with the priest of the parish, the churchwardens and various parochial officials heading a crowd of boys who beat the parish boundary markers with green boughs, usually birch or willow. Sometimes the boys were whipped or violently bumped on the boundary stones to make them remember. The object of taking boys along is supposed to ensure that witnesses to the boundaries should survive as long as possible, and the bumping or whipping would jolly well make them remember.

You can imagine old Jed, supping his pint in the Red Lion, describing to young Nathan how he was repeatedly banged against that big old oak tree at the bottom of Bilmarsh Lane and then flung in the ditch some 70 years ago. Perhaps however, and here I speculate, the beating of young boys was nothing to do with solidifying memory but in some way harking back to the pagan sacrifices to the old spirits of the wood!

Then, through the years, across the centuries, the custom has disappeared from rural life in most parts of the country, though it still survives in parts of Oxford, Cambridge, and perhaps not surprisingly, Bodmin! But what is certain is that the Bounds of Myddle Parish haven't been beaten for many years.

PART 2 - The idea

I will now explain what this is all about. My name is Bob Griffiths, and I have lived at Houlston all my life. My daughter, who is at University studying philosophy (as if that is an explanation), came up with the idea of trying to walk all the way around the Parish boundary, just to see if it could still be done, and if indeed it was still identifiable in the 21st Century.

As a line on a map, it matters because it represents an administrative area which elects the Parish Council, the first level of local democracy. But we also wanted to find out if it matters on the ground by looking at the geography and land use and the form of the boundary. We decided to just walk the old Myddle boundary from before it was combined with Broughton. Mapping it into the Ordnance Survey app on my phone, we see that its about 17 ½ miles. More than an afternoon's amble then!

The map below isn't quite accurate as the construction of Sleap airfield in the 1940s disrupted the original boundary which roughly went from east to west across the middle of the airfield. The modern boundary follows the Sleap Brook to the north of the airfield. We decided to follow the Perimeter Track to the north keeping parallel with the modern boundary.
